



Residential Support Workers

The Community Restorative Centre (CRC) is a community based agency providing assistance to people affected by the criminal justice system.

We require:

- Casual Residential Support Workers
- Various Shifts including weekend and nights shifts
- SACS Award G3Y4 Casual rate

Based in Rutherford NSW, Residential Support Workers will be required to provide intensive transitional accommodation support services to male clients who have an intellectual disability, and, who have contact with the criminal justice system. Support services are delivered on site 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

Essential Criteria:

- Demonstrated casework experience with men who have an intellectual disability, who have had contact with the criminal justice system, and who may have AOD issues, mental health issues and challenging behaviours.
- Experience in providing casework support to clients with complex needs
- Experience in the delivery of living skills programs
- Knowledge of the issues facing people with intellectual disability, who are in contact with the criminal justice system.
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team toward a shared goal of best practise.
- Drivers License
- First Aid Certificate or willingness to obtain one.

Desirable:

- Counselling skills
- Knowledge of issues relating to Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander communities
- Knowledge of issues relating to Culturally and Linguistically Diverse communities
- Knowledge of current Child Protection issues and legislation
- Knowledge of Disability Standards and relevant legislation.

Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islanders & people from culturally & linguistically diverse communities are encouraged to apply.

Applications must include a Statement Addressing the Selection Criteria and a brief resume.
