Details of pick up points

1. **Central** - bay 18 on Pitt Street
2. **Strathfield** - Everton Rd, long distance coach stop
3. **Parramatta** –Fitzwilliam Street, long distance coach stop
5. **Penrith** - bay 13 near taxi rank

We have a 30-minute refreshment stop each way where there are fast-food outlets, toilets and a place to stretch your legs
