CRC is an incorporated association and a registered charity.


Our Mission

INNER CITY WOMEN'S TRANSITIONAL SERVICE



An outreach case management, transitional and reintegration service for women with a history of involvement in the criminal justice system.



INNER CITY WOMEN'S TRANSITIONAL SERVICE

The Inner City Women's Transitional service provides outreach and case management support to women exiting NSW Correctional Centres who have complex needs.

To be eligible for the project, clients must:

- Be homeless or be at risk of homelessness
- Be voluntarily seeking support
- Have a release date confirmed and set if eligible for parole
- Want to return to the Inner City and surrounding suburbs
- Have a number of identified, complex needs
- Have a history of involvement with the criminal justice system
- Where possible, be referred three months prior to release

Staff wishing to make a referral are required to complete a Sydney Transition Program Referral Form, which must then be emailed to sydney.transition@crcnsw.org.au to be considered for assessment.

It is important for women to be aware that CRC cannot guarantee accommodation on release; however, we can support women in this area. At times, this will involve utilising Housing NSW Temporary Accommodation (TA) and liaising with other services to secure alternative accommodation. We provide case management and support for up to 12 months.

The Inner City Women's Transitional Service is part of the Inner City Service for Women with Complex Needs and operates in partnership with specialist services B Miles and Detour House. The project is funded by Family and Community Services (FACS).

Those wishing to be referred to our service should contact a Services and Programs Officer (SAPO) or Parole Officer within their facility.

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
